

CDMT Recognised Teacher Award

Six Requirements

Teachers applying for the CDMT Recognised Teacher Award from CDMT must confirm that they comply with the following *Requirements* at the time of application and for so long as they hold the CDMT Recognised Teacher Award:

- **Professional policies and procedures** – have appropriate policies and adhere to strict procedures in respect of the following: health and safety (including, where appropriate, safe dance practice), equal opportunities and customer service (including, without limitation, in respect of dealing with any complaints which the individual receives)*
- **A Children and Adults at Risk Protection Policy and Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) disclosure** – hold and adhere to a Children and Adults at Risk Protection Policy, and as part of this policy, to undertake and hold an Enhanced Disclosure and Barring check or its equivalent where available
- **Insurance** – hold appropriate and adequate insurance
- **Code of Professional Conduct and Practice** – adhere to CDMT's *Code of Professional Conduct and Practice for Teachers* or an equivalent code recognised by the Council
- **Information disclosure** – prominently display at all times, enable students to access or provide on request to all students a copy of the *Six Requirements* for Recognised Teachers, full routine and emergency contact details; timetables; and details of venues and examinations, public performances, competitions and/or displays
- **Teaching qualification** – Hold a CDMT, Ofqual or other government-recognised teaching qualification at RQF Level 3 or above or hold a performance based degree and Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) or Qualified Teacher Learning and Skills (QTLS).

Notes:

- * *Teachers may wish to attend seminars provided by individual Awarding Organisations in these areas, in order to assist in their development*
